
It look like the existing trees were evergreens from the first view below. The trees look further away than some of the trees on 312th. Also are two pictures showing the trees on the left side of the picture.



The second view are the cross-sections in this area. The cross-sections are showing more of a fill in this area than a cut. However I know how adjustments could have been made in the field related with ditch grading. We would have shots on the existing ditch elevation in this area from the original survey and could compare it to the new ditch. However I would defer to Tanner on what he recalls if one tree was taken down in the past. I can try to see what Jeremy has in his correspondence file too if this issue came up before.

We usually see tree issues on projects where we are putting in utilities and cutting across roots. I know that evergreens throughout the state are having some diseases spreading through them. I am constantly seeing it. The evergreens to the west of 31075 seem to have something going on with them. Those pictures are from 2017.



If Tanner felt we had not affected the roots, then it may be the those evergreens are getting that disease that is showing up in evergreens.


Subject: ROW Trees

I have a property owner with trees in the right-of-way (19.00147.00, Ron and Rosemary Masloski, 31075 Gable); the trees are dying. Mr. Masloski said that when they did the 2018 street project they cut the roots of the trees for the ditch. This is why the trees are dying. He would like to have the trees removed before someone is hurt. My understanding is that Tanner did remove one of the trees.
