Describe Detailed Comment or Concern: Once again, I'm pleading with the City Council to authorize proper dust treatment on Foxhill Avenue this spring and as needed throughout the summer. Proper meaning not just a sprinkling of chemical down the center of the road, but a full width treatment. Due the increase in houses in Lent Township over the past 20 years on Foxhill Avenue, and the paving of their roads, there is an increase in traffic on the non-paved portion of Foxhill Avenue at increased speeds causing an increase of dust. Many people do not stop at the stop sign at 314th, allowing speeds to be higher; the speed limit signs disappeared and were never replaced. The dust lingers long after a vehicle passes which prevents enjoyment of the outdoors; everything is covered in dirt, it's impossible to keep anything clean.

In addition, a properly treated road would require less maintenance. As maintenance is done now, the road becomes washboard within a day or two of grading. Someone, typically riders of ATVs, and occasionally a vehicle, will spin donuts at Foxhill Ave and 314th Street creating deep ruts.

I would imagine this is an issue in any area of the city which may still have dirt roads. Please consider pavement or some other longer term solution in the near future. I would think that if the dirt roads were paved, maintenance costs would decrease as well as the need for the equipment needed for this type of road maintenance. If Lent Township can pave all their roads, why can't the City of Stacy?
