72.04 SEASONAL PARKING RESTRICTIONS.

No person shall park a vehicle or permit a vehicle to stand upon any public street, highway, alley or mobile home park street during the following times:

(A) At any time after a snowfall, wind or other weather condition has resulted in the accumulation of snow of 3 inches more in depth on the public street, highway, alley or mobile home park street until the street, highway, alley or mobile home park street is completely plowed; or

(B) Between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. from October 1 through May 15 of each calendar year.

Keep the Your Sidewalk Clear

Stacy City Code § 93.02 SNOW, ICE, DIRT AND RUBBISH.

(A) Duty of owners and occupants. The owner and the occupant of any property adjacent to a public sidewalk shall use diligence to keep such walk safe for pedestrians. No such owner or occupant shall allow snow, ice, dirt or rubbish to remain on the walk longer than 24 hours after its deposit thereon.

(B) Removal by city. The City Maintenance Officer shall remove from all public sidewalks all snow, ice, dirt and rubbish as soon as possible beginning 24 hours after any such matter has been deposited thereon or after the snow has ceased to fall. He or she shall keep a record showing the cost of such removal adjacent to each separate lot and parcel and shall deliver such information to the City Clerk.

THE PROPERTY OWNER WILL BE BILLED IF THE CITY REMOVES THE SNOW



Burning Regulations. Entire chapter 91 can be found on our website or by contacting the clerk's office:

Definitions:

RECREATIONAL FIRE. A fire set with approved starter fuel no more than 3 feet in height, contained within the border of a "recreational fire site" using dry, clean wood; producing little detectable smoke, odor or soot beyond the property line; conducted with an adult tending the fire at all times; for recreational, ceremonial, food preparation for social purposes; extinguished completely before quitting the occasion; and respecting weather conditions, neighbors, burning bans, and air quality so that nuisance, health or safety hazards will not be created. No more than 1 recreational fire is allowed on any property at 1 time.

RECREATIONAL FIRE SITE. An area of no more than a 3-foot diameter circle (measured from the inside of the fire ring or border); completely surrounded by non-combustible and non-smoke or odor producing material, either of natural rock, cement, brick, tile or blocks or ferrous metal only an which area is depressed below ground, on the ground, or on a raised bed. Included are permanent outdoor wood burning fireplaces. Burning barrels are not a "recreation fire site" as defined herein. Recreational fire sites shall not be located closer than 25 feet to any structure.

§ 91.25 BURNING OF LEAVES PERMITTED.

The burning of dried leaves is permitted within the corporate limits of the city only in accordance with conditions set forth herein.

§ 91.26 TIME.

The burning of dried leaves shall be permitted to occur from 8:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. within the period from September 16 to November 30 of each year.

§ 91.27 LOCATION.

The burning of dried leaves shall be permitted on a person's own property, and such burning must be conducted a minimum of 25 feet from all buildings, structures and flammable materials, including tall grass and weeds.

§ 91.28 FIRE ON LAND OF OTHERS RESTRICTED.

No person shall burn any dried leaves upon the land of another without the permission of the owner thereof or his or her agent.

§ 91.29 BURNING ON PUBLIC PROPERTY.

The burning of leaves is prohibited on city streets, boulevards, lake shores or any public property by private citizens.

§ 91.30 ATTENDANCE OF FIRES.

Any fire authorized by this subchapter shall be constantly attended by a competent adult until such fire is extinguished. This person shall have a garden hose connected to a water supply or other fire extinguishing equipment readily available for use.

You can obtain a burn permit from city hall; (there is no charge for this permit).

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

Tests show levels of radium 226 and radium 228
above drinking water standards

Stacy public water supply routinely monitors for the presence of drinking water contaminants. Recent testing results show that the average level of combined radium 226 and 228 was 6.2 picoCuries per liter (pCi/L). This is above the standard or maximum contaminant level (MCL), of 5.4 pCi/L.

Radium 226 and radium 228 occur naturally within the groundwater. Some people who drink water containing radium in excess of the MCL over many years may have an increased risk of getting cancer.

This is not an emergency. You do not need an alternative source of water, such as bottled water. However if you have specific health concerns, consult your doctor. Home water treatment units are available to reduce radium 226 and radium 228, which include water softening, reverse osmosis, and distillation. It is recommended that these home water treatment units be certified to ensure radium removal. The use of carbon filters is not recommended for removal of radium, as radium may accumulate in the filter over time.

Your public water supply is exploring methods to reduce the level of radium 226 and radium 228, which may include an alternative water source or water treatment. You will be informed when the public water supply has reduced the level of radium and meets the standard.

Please share this information with all other people who drink this water, especially those who may not have received this notice directly (for example, people in apartments, nursing homes, schools, and businesses). You can do this by posting this notice in a public place or distributing copies by hand or mail.

PLEASE NOTE: this is not something caused by the city's maintenance of the system, it is naturally occurring in the aquifer.

As required by the Minnesota Department of Health you will be receiving this notice on a quarterly basis until the radium levels are at acceptable levels.
